

From the Buffalo Commercial of Saturday.
More of the Dead.

By vessels from the West this morning, we learn that quite a large number of bodies have been recovered and taken in at points near the scene of disaster. Capt. Blair, of the schooner *Adelaide*, informs that he picked up fifteen persons, two of whom were Swiss females, yesterday, and took them into Silver Creek. He should judge from the appearance of the others that they were mostly Americans and cabin passengers. Two of them had silver watches in their vest pockets, and one, a small sized man, a black colored life preserver on, uninflated. His apparel was black or dark color; can't say whether he had a watch or not. (This is probably the body of Mr. Lynde.) Another was a colored man with a check apron on, similar to those worn by the cooks. The whole were delivered to deputy sheriff Phillips, of Silver Creek.

Captain B. also informs us that thirteen persons, including five females, were picked up and taken into Dunkirk, yesterday, by the steamboat *Perry*, and we learn that three more bodies were found on Grand Island last evening.

The Rochester, last evening, brought into this port five bodies, and among them was that of Miss Miller. Her funeral took place to-day.

THE LOST.—The following is a description of the bodies brought in by the Rochester on Thursday evening:—

No. 1—A German, about 35 years old, linen marked H. P. S. 5 feet 9 inches high; had on a brown linen frock coat, worked striped vest, white cotton shirt, blue cotton pants, coarse boots, silver watch, 2 keys, 4 five franc pieces, \$6.15 in change.

No. 2—A man, 6 feet high, 45 years old; snuff coat, satinet pants, striped vest, cotton shirt, common boots; specie \$4, bills \$5, wallet and papers, (Justice Sherman)

No. 3—A man 6 feet high, 25 years old; black dress coat, satinet pants, black silk vest, cotton shirt, common boots; \$2 in bills, \$1.20 in change; 6 table spoons, a quantity of medals; certificate that Wm. Williams, Jr. is qualified to teach school, dated 1838, signed Moses E. Saunders, E. P. Solmon.

No. 4—A German, 5 feet 8 inches high, 25 years old; brown satinet pants, cotton shirt, brown cloth vest; one dollar in change.

No. 5—A man 25 years old, 5 feet 10 inches high; black dress coat and pants, silk velvet vest, cotton shirt, calf boots, a song book, \$8 in bills, \$9 in change; a few sheets of music marked Chauncey Blossom, wallet, pencil case, two keys, steel tobacco box.

No. 6—A man, dark dress coat, cotton shirt, satinet pants, blue vest, common boots, silv. watch, \$106 in bills, 9 sovereigns, 8 in change; wallet, pencil case, knife and 2 combs; letter directed to Henry Smith, Jefferson Co. W. T. signed by Josiah Smith; another letter dated Paris Hill, 1 day 8mo. 1841, supposed to be from Paris.

No. 7—E. S. Cobb, gold watch, 2 gold rings, pocket hdkfs., gold pin, bunch of keys, knife, gloves, purse with \$1.13 in change, and \$21 in bills; \$50 in Detroit shipplasters, and a check on the Treasurer of the State Bank of Mich'gan, for \$156.

No. 8—A German, 5 feet 6 inches high; blue roundabout, striped vest, blue pants, coarse boots, cotton shirt.

No. 9—A German, velvet roundabout and vest, blue cotton pants, cotton shirt, marked "L. B.," silver watch, 5 five franc pieces, 5s. in change, tobacco box.

No. 10—A German, dark coat, figured velvet vest, blue cloth pants, common shoes, 7 gold pieces, half sovereigns, \$2 in silver, letter in German.

No. 11—A man, brown frock coat, velvet collar, silk velvet vest, satin pants, white shirt, calf boots;

5 feet 10 inches high, 30 years old, had in his wallet the following bill:—"Syracuse, Mr. P. B. Storm, box of P. W. Andrews, coats cloth and trimmings, \$9.00—charged R. R. Phelps;" \$2 bill and \$13.50 in specie.

No. 12.—A German, had a ticket marked "J. Wilbur, 6 passengers, P. L. Parsons & Co." blue cloth roundabout, coarse vest, striped cotton pants, white shirt, thick boots, silver watch; 5 feet 8 inches high, 35 years old; 4 five franc pieces, 63 cts in change, letters in German, pocket toak, shirt and hdkf. marked "J. W."

No. 13.—A German; velvet roundabout, black cloth vest, striped pants, white shirt marked "A S.;" 6 feet high, 35 years old; 5 five franc pieces, 83 cents in change; knife, toak, steel, 2 leather pouches, 2 keys.

No. 14.—Edmund Griffin; black frock coat, figured pants, white shirt, calf boots, silver watch, tobacco box, \$1.96 in bills \$2.30 in change, pencil case, gold pen, knife, comb; note from Webster & Griffin to Edmund Griffin for \$2000, dated New York, 21st March, 1836.

No. 15.—A man, dark pants, striped shirt; thick boots, supposed to be one of the hands; knife, wallet, \$3 in bills, a receipt signed by Florence Groull to Jerry Shesan for \$228, and 7 sovereigns left in his hands, payable on demand, dated Aug. 3, 1811.

No. 16.—A German female; blue dress, linen marked "C. L. W.," 30 years old, 23 five franc pieces, 33 cents in change.

No. 17.—Eliza Packingham, chambermaid.

No. 18.—A German, linen marked "H. K.," blue cloth vest, blue linen pants, white shirt, thick boots, knife, key, 23 cents in change, bead bag, comb.

No. 19.—A man, brown linen pants, white shirt, wallet, metal comb, about 35 years.

No. 20.—A female, calico dress, black silk apron, brown shirred bonnet, black lace veil, black slippers, white cotton hose, bead purse, \$9 in bills, 13 cents in change, black kid gloves, one ring, 25 years old.

No. 21.—A German female, blue dress, white woolen stockings, thimble and key in pocket, about 20 years old.

The Rochester returned again last evening, with the following, picked up below Sturgeon Point:—

No. 1.—A man, apparently about 40 years old, without shoes or stockings; had on a striped shirt, tow cloth pants, and a white Marselles vest; black hair, stout built, and about six feet high. In his pocket were a jackknife and wooden comb. Probably a deck hand.

No. 2.—A man, say 35 or 36 years old, without shoes or stockings; had on a red flannel and cotton shirt, light colored satinet pants, no vest or coat; dark colored hair, stout built, and about 5 feet 10 or 11 inches high. In his pocket were found a wallet (empty, except a blank paper) and a lock horn handle knife, with three blades. Probably a fireman.

No. 3.—Miss Althea Miller, aged about 22 years, sister of Messrs. W. G. & I. C. Miller, of Buffalo.

No. 4.—A man, aged say 30 years; had on a striped shirt, satinet pants, blue broadcloth roundabout, and a net under shirt; around his body was a light plaid pocket handkerchief, containing three half eagles, a half sovereign, and \$6 in bills. Had a wallet and a wooden comb; no hair upon his head, small size, and about 5 feet 6 or 7 inches in height; no name.

No. 5.—A man about 23 years old, sandy hair, red flannel under shirt and cotton ditto, tow cloth pants; no coat, vest, or shoes; about middling size, height say 6 feet. In his pocket were found a pearl handle knife, with the handle broken, and a wooden comb. Probably a fireman.

EVANS, Sept. 2, 1811.—Three persons were found yesterday and one to-day, on the beach.

No. 1.—A German. It appeared by papers found on him that his name was Lathold—shipped by P. L. Parsons & Co.,—he had two silver watches, five five franc pieces, and some other small articles.

No. 2 is D. S. Slown of Geneva, as appears by the list of lost published, and papers found with the body; he had \$122 31, one silver watch, with a flat gold key with his name thereon.

No. 3—A colored man, taken in charge of by Mr. Aldrich, of whom we have no description.

No. 4—A German female, about 20 years old; nothing found on her to identify, except the initials on her underclothes, "H. I. K."

The property is in the hands of Mr. Salisbury.

EVANS, Sept. 3, 1811.—Last evening we found a German boy about 15 years old. Mr. Aldrich took charge of the body. I have no description, but there was nothing found on him. No. the grave 5.

The revenue cutter, Capt. Knapp, sent a body on shore this morning. I send a description below:

No. 6—An American, about 6 feet high, light brown hair, had on brown strap body coat, with metal buttons, blue cotton jean pants, light striped vest, cotton shirt, black silk cravat, calf skin boots, pegged, mixed woolen socks. Had a leather guard about the body, containing \$10 in specie, calf skin pocket book and small wallet, containing \$33,13; silver spectacles, heavy frames; trunk key and pocket knife, and a single truss about the body; common double sleeve buttons; could find no papers on him to ascertain the name. The property is in my hands. W. S. REIS.

MONK BODIES.—The Rochester, Captain Allen, is just in, bringing five bodies, three males and two females, (Germans,) found floating near where the Erie was burned.

No. 1.—A German; age 25 years; height 5 ft 11 in; home made pantaloons, "H. E." marked on his shirt, sandy hair.

No. 2.—A German; 6 feet high; Dutch cloth pantaloons; roundabout of the same; striped cotton vest; "H. E." marked on his shirt; hair sandy. He had a silver Dutch watch, and \$1,25 in cash.

No. 3.—A German; height 6 feet; home made drab pants and coat; "H. V." marked on shirt; badly burned. Had a silver watch and nine five franc pieces.

No. 4.—A German female; age 20 years; 5 feet 6 inches high; blue calico frock; and woolen stockings.

No. 5.—A German female; height 5 feet 4 inches; woolen stocking; scarcely any clothing except a petticoat.
