NO. 46 PINE STREET

By vessels from the West this morning, we learn that quite a large number of bodies have been recovered and taken in at points near the scene of disaster. Capt. Blair, of the schooner Adelaide, inwere Swiss females, yesterday, and took them into Silver Creek. He should judge from the appearance of the others that they were mostly Americans and cabin passengers. Two of them had silver watches in their vest pockets, and one, a small sized man, a black colored life preserver on, unuffa-ted. His apparel was black or dark color; can't say whether he had a watch or not. (This is probably the body of Mr. Lynde.) Another was a colored man with a check apron on, similar to those worn by the cooks. The whole were delivered to deputy theriff Philips, of Silver Creek.

Captain B. also informs us that thirteen persons, including five females, were picked up and taken into Dunkirk, yesterday, by the steamboat Perry, and we learn that three more bodies were found on

Grand Island last evening.
The Rochester, last evening, brought into this ort five bodies, and among them was that of Miss Miller. Her funeral took place to-day.

THE LOST .- The following is a description of the bodies brought in by the Rechester on Thursday

No. 1-A German, about 35 years old, linen mark-ed H. P. S. 5 feet 9 inches high; had on a brown hnen frock coat, worked stoped vest, white cotton shirt, blue cotton pants, coarse boots, silver watch, 2 keys, 4 five franc pieces, \$6,15 in change. No. 2-A man, 6 feet high, 45 years old; snuff

coat, satinct pants, striped vest, cotton shirt, common boots; specie \$4, bills \$5, wallet and papers,

No. 6-A man, dark dress coat, cotton shirt, sat-inet pants, blue vest, common boots, silv. watch, 2106 in bills, 2 sovereigns, 8 in change; wallet,

pencil case, knife and 2 combs; letter directed to thenry Smsh, Jefferson Co. W. T. signed by Josiah Smith; another letter-dated Paris Hill, I day Smo. 1811, supposed to be from Paris.

No. 7—E. S. Gobb, gold watch, 2 gold rings, pocket highs, gold pin, bunch of keys, knifa, gloves, purse with \$1,13 in change, and \$21 in bills; \$50 in Detroit shinplasters, and a check on the Treasurer of the State Bank of Mich gan, for \$156.

No. 15-A man, dark pants, striped shirt; thick boots, supposed to be one of the hande; knife, wal-let, 53 in bills, a receipt segred by Florence Groulf to Jerry Shesan for \$338, and 7 sovereiges left in his hands, payable on deteand, dated Aug. 3, 1811.

No. 16-A German female; bluedress, linen mark-el 'C. L. W.," 30 years old, 23 five franc pieces, 33 cents in change.

No. 17-Eliza Packingham, chambermasd. No. 18-A. German, linen marked "H. K." blue cloth vest, blue linen pants, white shirt, thick books,

No. 13-A man, brown linen pants, white shirt,

wallet, metal comb, about 35 years.

No. 30-A female, calsen dress, black silk apren, brown shirrd bonnet, black lace well, black stoppers, white cotton hose, bead purse, \$9 in bills, 13 cents in change, black kid gloves, one ring, 25 years old.

No. 21.—A German female, blue dress, white woolen stockings, thimble and key in pocket, about 20 years old.

The Rochester returned again last evening, with the following, picked up below Sturgeon Point :-

No. 1.—A man, apparently about 10 years old, without shoes or stockings; had on a striped shirt, tow cloth pants, and a white Marsvilles vest; black hair, stout built, and about rix feet high. In his pocket were a jacknife and wooden comb. Probably a deck hand.

No. 2-A man, say 35 or 36 years old, wathout shoes or stockings; had on a red flannel and cotton shirt, light colored saturet pants, no vot or coat; dark colored hair, shout built, and about 5 feet 10 or Il moches high. In his pocket were found a walles (empty, except a blank paper) and a lock born han-

die knife, with three blades. Probably a fireman.
No. 3.—Mass Alathea Miller, aged about 22

Had a wallet and a wooden comb; no hair upon his head, small size, and about 5 feet 6 or 7 inches in height;

No. 5 .- A man about 23 years o'd, sandy hair, red flannel under shirt and cotton ditto, tow cloth pants; no coat, vest, or shees; about muldling size, height say 6 feet. In his pocket were found a year! handle knife, with the handle broken, and a wooden comb.

Probably a fireman.

The revenue cutter, Capt. Knapp, sent a body on shore this morning. I send a description below:

No 6-An American, about 6 feet high, light brown hair, had on brown strait body cost, with metal buttons, blue cotton jean pants, light striped vest, cotton shirt, black sife cravat, calf akin boots, regged, mixed wooden socks. Had a leather cuard about the body, containing \$10 in specie, calf akin pocket book and small wallet, containing \$33,13; silver spectacies, heavy frames; trunk key and pocket knife, and a single trues about the body; common double sleeve buttons; could find no papers on him to ascertain the name. The property is in my hands.
