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MAGNETIC TELEGRAPH.—The *Norristown* (Montgomery county, Pa.,) *Herald* says: —

“The survey of the route for the Telegraph from New York to Baltimore, is rapidly being made. A. C. Goell, the Surveyer, has arrived at this place, having surveyed the route from New York to New Hope, and thence by way of Doylestown to Norristown. We understand that it is contemplated to extend it hence to Baltimore, Philadelphia to be reached by a branch from this place, and this will consequently be a principal depot, connecting at once with Philadelphia, New York, Baltimore and Washington. We trust our citizens will give the project that encouragement its importance demands.”

The Telegraph between Boston and Lowell will be completed and in operation in a very few days. A meeting of parties interested in the Buffalo and Albany, Albany and New York, and Albany and Boston routes, will be held at Utica one day this week.
